Frequently Asked Questions

Who are we?

SCLC is a group of unpaid senior volunteers who teach computer skills to adults.

Where are we?

We are located at 441 Summer St, Abington, Ma. We rent a room from the Abington Council on Aging, but are not affiliated with them

When do classes begin?

We have two sessions a year, **Fall** and **Winter/Spring**. Registration for these sessions begin early in September and January. Please go to the website and click on **Classes**. Course offerings for Fall or Winter/Spring will be displayed.

What do you teach?

Please visit the website and click on **Classes**. Our classes are based primarily on the Windows 10 operating system, and range from Basic Introduction to Computers to Intermediate Windows 10. We also teach iPad, Tablets, Smart phones, iPhone, etc. Email and Internet access are also popular classes.

How do I enroll in a class?

Go to the website, click on **Register**, then click on **List of Courses, Dates, Day, Price, Instructor** to determine the start date.** Now click on **Class Registration Form**. Print the form, fill it out, attach a check made out to SCLC, and mail it to **SCLC c/o Abington COA, 441 Summer St., Abington, MA 02351**. Or come to the Abington COA, get a pre-printed registration form, fill it out, attach a check made out to SCLC, and put it in the special box for SCLC mail.

After being associated with the SeniorNet Program at Massasoit Community College for 13 years, the Senior Computer Learning Center of MASS (SCLC) was formed in 2011. SCLC is located at the Abington Council On Aging. The primary purpose of the program is to help to improve the computer skills of seniors. This is achieved by providing programs to seniors that use technology that would help them in their day-to-day lives. A curriculum has been developed that consists of programs that meet these objectives. The programs and workshops are offered at a very reasonable price and are taught by senior volunteer instructors and coaches.

Our classroom set-up consists of 10 desktop computers and 5 laptops. Ten have Microsoft's newest operating system, Windows 10, and five have Windows 7. The goal of our program is to help seniors navigate an ever-changing technology and their programs. Courses in using the computer and other devices (e.g., tablets & smartphones) have been developed and updated for our classes. Popular programs like the Internet, email, genealogy, eBay, Facebook, and social media are some of the courses that we have developed and updated. Though we use standard applications and programs, we use resources from the Internet and from programs developed by our staff.
